Dr. Graham is a graduate of Johnson C. Smith University (B.S. Marketing), University of Wisconsin (M.A. Afro-American Studies Media and Policy), and Stony Brook University (Ph.D. American History

with focus in Migration and Civil Rights).

He is the author of several academic and popular media essays on subjects ranging from Migration, Civil Rights, Black Power Movement, and Diversity and Inclusion. He is the Editor in Chief and contributor to the book, Faces of Reality: The State of Ethnic Charlotte. Dr. Graham will release two new books in the upcoming months, We've Come This Far By Faith: A Long Island Towns Struggle with Migration and Black Power and Then There Was Courage: Brave Moments in the Lives of Black Men.

As part of his civic life Dr. Graham is appointed by the Mayor of Charlotte as Chair of the Youth Committee for Charlotte Works and was appointed by the North Carolina Governor as 12th District Commissioner for North Carolina Social Service Commission. He also serves on the Board of the YMCA of Belmont, Chair of Advisory Board for Bank of Urban League of Central Carolinas, Advisory Board of Fifth Third Bank and former President of the Diversity Council of the Carolinas in addition to other boards and committees.

In 2012, Uptown Magazine awarded Dr. Graham the Charlotte Catalyst Humanitarian of the Year Award and the National Urban League named him Innovative Champion of the Year.
